

This leaflet covers Horden. From Horden train station you can connect with the coastal walks and visit the iconic Little Tern sculpture or explore the Limekiln Gill Local Nature Reserve.



All three walks connect to the King Charles III England Coast Path. This path is being developed and will soon go all the way around the coast of England. The section in Durham is fully open and provides wonderful views of the cliffs, beaches and coastal wildlife.

Watch the cows grazing in fields, take a photo of the Little Tern sculpture and maybe see dolphins and porpoises out to sea.

The walks follow well-marked paths and are suitable for most people, there are no steps but barriers restrict access for mobility scooters. There are benches to take a rest.

Take care on the coast, follow local signs and keep back from the cliff edge.

Explore the fabulous Durham coast with this series of walk leaflets offering short, easy walks from the coastal villages.

Each leaflet shows colour-coded walks. The green routes are the easiest, yellow routes are longer and the red routes are the most challenging.

There are 8 leaflets in the series, and an additional leaflet showing key bus routes and travel information.

Map key

 Green walk: 1 mile / 30 minutes

This walk follows good paths, there are benches for a rest half-way round. Access across the railway line is narrow, making this route unsuitable for mobility scooters.

 Yellow walk: 1.3 mile / 40 minutes

The walk follows clear paths, there are benches to rest along the way. Part of the route can be muddy in wet weather.

 Red walk: 1.3 mile / 40 minutes

The walk follows good paths, there are benches at several points along the way. A small kissing gate makes the route impassable to mobility scooters.

Please note: walk lengths are approximate. The walk time is based on an average walking speed of 2 miles per hour.
